# Workshops

Take a finished product home! The following workshops meet at The Growing Place, minimum of 10 people required. All materials provided.

- **Build A Fairy or Gnome House** A workshop for parent and child or adults. Create your own fairy or gnome house with logs, twigs, stones and a variety of other materials. Once you build the house, design a landscape around it!
- Holiday Wreath, Swag, Centerpiece or Container -Your group may select one of the above options. A designer will help in the design and creation process.
- Make a Miniature Garden Make a miniature garden vignette with a variety of miniature plants and accessories like arbors, fences, and other tiny treasures.
- Make a Stepping Stone Make a concrete stepping stone impressed with seasonal plants.
- Make a Trough Make a rustic, stone-like, lightweight container made of hypertufa concrete (approx. 15" x 20") that when planted will allow hardy plants to over winter. Succulents, perennials and miniature conifers are perfect choices for planting.
- Plant a Container for Spring, Summer or Fall -Your group may select one of the above options. A designer will help you in the design and creation process.
- Plant a Container of Bulbs for Forcing Work with a designer to create a container of bulbs to force for early spring blossoms.
- Vegetable & Herb Container Plant up a delicious container of vegetables and/or herbs that you and your family can enjoy.
- **Childrens' Groups** Provide a wonderful learning experience for your children. Enjoy a garden tour, a little talk about the parts of a plant, and a hands-on nature activity. Fees apply. Other seasonal activities include painting a flower pot or pumpkin crafts.
