In the prequel spin-off, from creators Vince Gilligan and Peter Gould, **Bob Odenkirk** perfectly captures a pre-*Breaking Bad* Saul Goodman, mostly called Jimmy McGill, who's working from an office in the back of a nail salon and pretending to be his own (English?) secretary on the phone, while trying to get a legitimate(ish) law firm off the ground.

Of course, one of his biggest problems is money, alongside an ego that he can't really afford to have just yet. It's clear that this is definitely not yet the Saul Goodman that we know and love, though we did get a little flash forward to present-day Saul, who works at a Cinnabon, goes by the name of Gene, and seems to spend his nights watching old tapes of his glory days.
