
A MESSAGE FROM THE PUBLISHER

With the Help of Father and Station 58, Baby Madeleine Is Born in Time for Holidays

Nothing brings the holiday message of "Peace On Earth, Goodwill Towards Mankind" closer to home than Ladera's own Paramedic Engine from Station 58 when it helped deliver a healthy baby girl unexpectedly at home last month.

"This was a defining moment in our family," said the still shocked proud father Patrick after he and a 9-1-1 operator collaborated to deliver his second daughter Madeleine Skye. "The dispatcher needs a big high-five!"

Patrick and his very pregnant wife Laure, a day late, spent that day low key. They order in from Chili's.

"I didn't feel like cooking," Laure shyly admitted though who could blame her in the very uncomfortable end stages of pregnancy.

Shortly after dinner, Patrick recognized pregnancy signs of "transitioning" thanks to a birthing class the couple took prior to the birth of their 2-1/2-year-old daughter Kayleigh.

He grabbed his fullycharged smart phone, hit speaker mode, and dialed 9-1-1, while Laure's body proceeded quickly towards delivery.

Fate delivered him to Collette Whitlock, a 15year Fire Communications Dispatcher, whose job it is to answer life threatening

calls. Her calm demeanor and specific instructions choreographed the call over the next several minutes. And while instructions were to keep the baby firmly inside the mother until paramedics arrived, Baby Madeleine had other plans.

"Patrick was very calm," recalled Collette. "He was a very good listener. I was just trying to convey the instructions. I was happy to be a part of Madeleine's birth."

Patrick, a mechanic and fabricator at an off-road shop, paid keen attention to Collette's instructions, while keeping his wife calm, keeping an eye on little Kayleigh and witnessing his child being born.

"Kayleigh was a team player," Patrick proudly said of his daughter who witnessed her baby sister's home delivery. "And the dispatcher was just really affirming. "I grew up around racing. I saw a lot of triumph and tragedy," he said while cradling his healthy baby girl. "It teaches you to trust yourself."

This success of this delivery had everything to do with all players remaining calm and receiving instructions from 9-1-1.

"We aren't overly religious, but we do believe in God. I know God was looking over us and that this is God's child."

Finally, Madeleine was



born and "pinked right up" Just in time for the fire crew to arrive and swiftly take

"Orange County Fire responds to over 120,000 calls a year and this past year we've only had six home deliveries," said OCFA Captain/PIO Steve Concialdi.

"This is pretty rare, however OCFA's highly trained dispatchers do a phenomenal job of staying calm and walking the callers through this very stressful situation.

Paramedics arrived on scene, quickly cleaned off the baby, wrapped her in warm blankets, and allowed the dad to cut the cord.

"Excellent work by all allowed a healthy baby girl to enter this world with an amazing story to tell forever," said Captain/PIO Steve. "The message is to stay calm and listen to the dispatcher."

Collette was awarded a stork pin by Fire Chief Jeffrey R. Bowman and the OCFA Board of Directors in for her help with the deliv-

"It's my first stork pin," Collette said. "If there's one thing people can do, it's to know your address. Most people call from cell phones. We need an address to get to you."

Patrick recalled calling his Mom in Texas around 9:25 pm on Nov. 11 to let her know the news!

"He said, 'I just delivered vour granddaughter!"" Granny Julie said. "I was asleep and he jokes all the time. But this time, I could tell his voice was serious. My son took over, was taking care of everybody," Granny Julie beamed. "I am so proud of him."

Patrick said, "I would do it all again in a heartbeat. It just gives you more confidence," he said. "It makes me really appreciate community. It makes you appreciate what these firefighters do every day."

"Madeleine Skye will always have a special connection to Station 58," he smiled proudly.



5th District Orange County Supervisor Pat **Bates Speaks**



Farewell to the Fabulous 5th District

South County is blessed with a remarkable landscape. rich in manmade wonders and natural resources.

With our majestic mountains, idyllic wilderness areas, picturesque parks, serene coastal hills & canyons, beautiful beaches, legendary historical sites, and charming communities, the Fifth District provides a quality of life that is truly unsurpassed.

For the last eight years, I have been truly honored to serve the residents and businesses of the Fabulous Fifth District.

Over the last several weeks, I have spent time reflecting on the promises I made to the Fifth District residents during my campaign for Supervisor, which began two years before the 2006 election.

My philosophy about public service has always been simple – listen to the people you represent and don't be afraid to take a stand.

I have worked hard to preserve and protect the quality of life we enjoy as residents of this great county, and accomplishing the goals I set forth in my campaign.

These reflected the priorities that you, a Fifth District constituents, shared with me as I walked precincts, worked phone banks, and participated in the many candidate forums.

These priorities fell into three areas: Finances; Government Transparency and Accountability; and Transpor-

One of the highest priorities for the Fifth District in 2006 and continuing today is traffic congestion relief. With the passage of Measure M2, the half-cent sales tax extension in 2006, Orange County as a whole will receive approximately \$15.5 billion over the next 30 years. I am proud to say that improvements to South 1 has sold out and construction County roads and freeways are high on the Measure M2 project priority list.

In addition to widening Interstate 5 from San Juan Capistrano to San Clemente, expanding traffic light signal synchronization on our arterials, and interchange improvements from El Toro to San Clemente we also broke ground on the long awaited La Pata Avenue Gap Closure Project.

Financially, our future is bright. The County's bankruptcy payoff will be completed in the next several years and will provide millions more in funding to the County's General Fund available for services such a public safety and capital projects.

During my tenure I have also joined my Board Colleagues in efforts to reduce the size and cost of county government in the amount of \$1.3 billion less in expenditures and eliminated numerous positions making the County government more efficient.

Beginning in 2013, the Fifth District became the focus for job creation and an uptick in our economy, which was great news for our county.

Due to a rebound in construction and housing industry, the cornerstone of our local economy, the Ranch Plan opened in June 2013.

The Ranch's Planning Area in Planning Area 2 is currently underway.

The Harbor Revitalization Project is also on track with construction on the commercial core scheduled to begin followed by waterside docks and

Throughout my tenure on the Board of Supervisors, we have initiated a number of reforms to ensure Government Accountability and Transparency. These reforms include establishing an Office of Independent Review that provides full time civilian oversight of critical incidents and allegations of officer misconduct being investigated by the Sheriff Internal Affairs Department.

We also established a Police Community Reconciliation Program that provides

individuals an opportunity to seek resolution of a grievance regarding perceived abusive, disrespectful treatment by a police/sheriff officer through direct contact with the Sheriff's Department and the officer involved.

Additionally, the Board established the Performance Audit Department which is tasked with reviewing all departments to ensure County policies and procedures are being followed.

Our work to date has reaped significant financial benefits and improved work place code of conduct.

I have been fortunate to serve the residents of South County in one capacity or another. I learned as one of the early leaders in our successful effort to stop the El Toro airport that dedicated people, working together, can overcome great odds and make a lasting difference for their communities.

I believe the oath taken by elected officials is not merely a set of words, it is a solemn obligation to adhere to the constitution, uphold the rule of law, and defend the principles of our republic. It is an oath I have taken many times, and one I am preparing to take again as your Senator in the 36th District.
