'Extreme Makeover' meets Habitat TV show host lends a hand to make home-building blitz a success

HILLSBOROUGH -- Didiayer Snyder built a tree house at 6, has a degree in carpentry and interior design and years of experience with Habitat for Humanity.

But the cast member of ABC's "Extreme Makeover Home Edition," is hammering a message alongside the nails on a six-city tour for Habitat's Home Builders Blitz 2008.

"On Extreme Makeover Home Edition we build a house in a week, but this week 263 houses will be built," Snyder told volunteers Monday in Hillsborough's Fairview neighborhood.

"That doesn't happen without the support of the community."

About three dozen people sat around wooden picnic tables, fanning the stiff air and clinging to the shade of a tiny patch of tent as Snyder spoke about the importance of affordable housing. A native of Australia, Snyder said home ownership is an integral part of the American Dream.

"This is really important because as of 2006, over 34 million people lived below the federal poverty line," she said.

"In a country like America, that's unacceptable."

Frank Wiesner, vice president of Raleigh-based Olde South Homes Inc., is working on his third house for the annual Blitz.

"I have so much fun every day," she said.

"This will give them a home to go to and that's something everyone deserves, so I'm glad I could help," she said.

Snyder said she joined Habitat for Humanity to improve her carpentry skills but quickly became addicted to the sense of accomplishment she got helping needy families.

"When you experience something like that it's contagious and you can't stop."
